MAKING THE MOST OF MINCE

Mince and Batter Patties

1 cup flour

1 teasp salt

1 teasp baking powder

1 egg

1 cup milk

1 onion finely chopped

750gr mince

1/2 cup tomato sauce

1 cup grated cheese

oil for frying

Mix together flour, baking powder, salt and egg beaten with milk

Add onion, mince, tomato sauce, and cheese to batter - stir well.

Heat oil in frypan and drop in tablespoons of the mixture. Cook for approximately 5 minutes each side. To halve this mixture, use a whole egg with less milk.

SILVERSTREAM BRANCH

60sUp of Silverstream, Upper Hutt, heard recently from Hutt Hospital's ED nurse, Stephanie Beddis, that around 18,000 children are treated there each year – and they are some of the sickest children in the country.

After being voted 'New Zealand's Hardest Working Nurse', Stephanie handed her prize money of \$10,000 to the Silverstream Lions Club as seed funding for a vision she had of the hospital's paediatric ED section being the most beautiful place a child could ever come to. And so the Tree Hutt came to be.

Frightened children no longer wait with, sometimes aggressive, patients in a tired waiting room, but enter a beautiful calming area where they can see and touch local book illustrator Rachel Driscoll's larger than life characters from New Zealand nature – Matilda the morepork, Pip the kiwi, Poko the kakapo, Sam the tuatara, Lulu the huhu grub and Wiki the weta together with bird song and a couple of moving trains. Nurses using such total distraction therapy find stress and anxiety is reduced and there is no longer a need to hold children down for treatment. It makes mothers' experience of the ED a good one as well.

Stephanie has been supported on her amazing journey by the local community, including Rotary Clubs, Cars for Charity, businessmen and schools. Volunteers knit small teddies for children in trauma and merino blankets for babies. Prayer blankets are quilted for the dying and scrub tops and pillowcases are decorated with Tree Hutt characters. All in all, a wonderfully inspiring project, which can be enjoyed by Googling 'The Tree Hutt'. Thank you so much, Stephanie.

The 60sUp Club of Silverstream was also contacted by local resident and international fabric artist, Kathy Morrison.

Kathy loves crafting by hand and tries to use only recycled fabrics, obtained mainly from op-shops or from friends. She enjoys using blankets, sheets and pillow cases to tell stories and now has about 300 blankets in her collection.

Kathy's interest in stitching began when she was a young nurse working in casualty. After being introduced to quilting some 35 years ago, and using the American style, she moved on to doing work with concepts and narratives. She travelled to the States with Toi Maori to meet American natives doing similar work. She has watched women in really reduced circumstances create beautiful items from next to nothing, while sitting on a dirt floor and using a thick needle. Kathy has since exhibited all around the world and been featured in 'New Zealand House and Garden' and also in 'Quilter'.

The club was treated to a viewing of some of her works including one of her most colourful (pictured) which features well known New Zealand women, including Katherine Mansfield, Jean Batten and Jacinda Ardern. Kathy feels it is so nice to make things, especially with natural products, and says she hopes to craft fabrics until the day she dies.
