
Subs due for 2024 -2025, will be discussed at the **AGM in May**, so please **don't pay** until after this meeting

The Green Footed Kiwi Dahlia Farm & Pioneer Village trip to Kaikohe

The day, Friday 2nd February, was lovely & sunny. The coach was luxurious & anticipation was high as a large group of members were looking forward to the first outing of the year.

We were off to Kaikohe to visit the Dahlia Farm, started off by three lovely sisters, Millie 13, Gracie 11 & Lexi-rose, almost 9. They told us how it all started 4 years ago, the area bought by their parents being just an open field. However, all it took was the love of 3 dahlia plants which developed into the myriad of colour & form seen growing today & all from seed rather than the normal tubers or cuttings. The focus now being to develop strains resistant to powdery mildew fungus to which they are susceptible.

An amazing & delicious morning tea was provided with a selection of tasty sandwiches, fresh scones with jam & cream, assorted cakes, cocktail tomatoes from the garden, tea, coffees & cold water. Many of us didn't need lunch after all this sustenance.

We then visited the Pioneer Village where we were met by a suitably attired Mrs Brown, formerly a teacher who refers to herself as Miss Strict when visited by school children. In the late 1800s, teachers were not allowed to be married. Among the many small original buildings which included a lovely church with beautiful kauri pews, lectern, organists stool & a stained glass window. We could see what life was like in those days by stepping back in time as we looked around the blacksmiths, post office, general store, jail house, school etc. I especially enjoyed reading of the rules & regulations for both students & teachers alike. I well recall having to adhere to some of those rules during my grammar school days in England. Today's students don't know how lucky they are.

Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the day which was well worth experiencing.
